He began working in television in 2013, as a storyliner on Coronation Street, where he worked for two-and-a-half years. During that time, he helped kill Hayley Cropper. He subsequently worked in drama development for companies such as Playground Entertainment and Lime Pictures, and started writing his own scripts. Something Borrowed – part of the Mark Gatiss-curated series QUEERS (BBC4) - was his first script commission.

Exposure - White Right: Meeting the Enemy won the International News and Current Affairs Emmy, and Gareth is currently a development producer and writer at Fuuse Films.
