He was subsequently featured as one of Screen's 'Stars of Tomorrow' and signed a one-picture blind deal with Tobey Maguire's Material Pictures for whom he is writing and will direct and original science-fiction love story. In spring 2016, Oscar and technologist collaborator created Benjamin, the world's first AI screenwriter, and shot the first purely AI-written film Sunspring. In Summer 2016, Temple Hill and 20th Century Fox acquired Ben Mezrich's upcoming book 'Woolly: The True Story of the De-Extinction of One of History's Most Iconic Creatures' for Oscar to adapt and Direct. He is also developing features with Echo Lake Entertainment and SUMS.
